

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO LIVE IN A HOMEOWNERS **ASSOCIATION?**

A homeowner's association is an organization developed in order to manage a community of houses, townhouses or condominiums. When you buy a home that is part of a homeowner's association, or HOA, you agree to abide by the association's rules and pay a fee that contributes to the overall maintenance and management of the community.

Remember that the Board makes rules on your behalf- to protect your investment. The staff or volunteers you see walking or driving around the community are the association's staff. They're inspecting the property to ensure that everything is working properly, that conditions are safe, and that nothing is reducing property values.



In short, they're making sure policies and rules are being followed—from pet behavior, parking and unkempt lawns to improper exterior modifications and more. They field complaints from fellow homeowners and, if necessary, remind you (or your neighbor) when a rule has been overlooked. Please remember that it is the responsibility of each owner to ensure their home and lot are being properly maintained- it is not the responsibility of the Association to remind or notify you.

Most issues are easily resolved. If not, the next step for fines to be imposed and a hearing before the compliance committee. THIS IS NOT THE INTENT OF THE ASSOCIATION. All we ask is that owners and residents keep their homes looking their best and follow the posted guidelines.

Compliance committee hearings are held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 6pm at 3489 Hiatus Road. If you have been fined and wish to be placed on the agenda please contact the office.

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

HOOD -Open

PAINT/EXTERIOR -Quality, Cleanliness & Luster

ENGINE COMPARTMENT- Cleanliness, Neatness, Workmanship, Wiring, Chrome, Underside of Hood, No visible leaks.

EXTERIOR-Cleanliness, Body Panel Fit, Glass, Wheels, Tires, Convertible Tops/Targas/T-tops/Roof, Door Handles, Bumpers, Outside Mirrors, Tailpipes and Wheel Wells.

INTERIOR-Cleanliness, Fit & Finish, Weather-stripping/Rubber, Dash, Console, Steering Column, Luggage Area, Upholstery, Visors, Door Panels, Door Jams, Carpet, Glass, Seat Belts.



Garbage cans, recycle bins, debris and bulk items left in view bring down the appearance of your community.

A simple <u>no cost</u> way to keep your area looking neat and clean is to store trash cans, recycle containers and other debris <u>out of street view</u> (in the garage, behind the fence or reasonable concealed with landscape material).

Keep containers closed and clean to avoid rodents and maggots.

Garbage, garbage cans and/or recycle bins should not be put curbside until the night before the scheduled pick up (regular trash pick up days are Tuesday and Friday).

Bulk trash is picked up each Tuesday and should not be placed curbside until Monday evening.

If you live in a sub-association please check with them regarding bulk pick up arrangements.

SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE

Single family (and some townhome) homeowners are responsible for maintenance (cleaning and repair) of the sidewalks abutting the home, including sidewalks that may be on



the side of or behind the home, even on the other side of a fence.

Mildewed, lifted or damaged sidewalks pose a tripping hazard that can result in bodily harm to persons walking on them, which could result in law suits to both the owner and the association. Welleby staff is continuously inspecting for damaged or dirty sidewalks, However, each owner should inspect and take corrective action without being notified by the association.

Please inspect the sidewalk abutting your home. If repairs are needed and your sidewalk is in a city right of way, the city of Sunrise has a program to


help owners with repairs at a reduced cost—contact the city at 954-572-2344 for more information. If your streets are private you will have to obtain your own contractor (city permit is required).



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We hope that all residents received the postcard we mailed regarding exterior maintenance responsibilities. To avoid a notice or additional notices if you have already received one, please ensure that all maintenance issues you may have are addressed:

- Roofs , flashing and house walls should be clean and free of mildew/algae (and walls properly painted)
- Fences and gates should have no loose or damaged boards/pickets and be free of mildew
- Asphalt driveways should be sealed annually to eliminate cracks and keep it water tight and oil stains should be removed
 immediately; this will keep your driveway maintained and in good condition for a longer period of time. Concrete driveways
 should be cleaned on a routine basis.
- Sidewalks and walkways must be free of lifts, cracks or any type of trip hazard and free of dirt, mildew or algae. Expansion cracks can be easily filled with paver sand that may be obtained at your local home store. Replacement of any sidewalk requires a city of Sunrise permit.
- Lawns should be maintained on a routine basis, treated for weeds/pests and properly watered (water restrictions are still in effect, please visit our website or SFWMD.gov).
- Dead/missing sod and plant material should be replaced, landscape borders should be clean and installed properly.
- Landscape areas and tree rings should be weed free (rocks or mulch help to keep weeds out of these areas)
- Landscape material should be neatly trimmed; dead palm fronds and seeds should be removed. Trees on lot should be properly trimmed by a licensed tree trimmer (city of Sunrise permit is required for tree trimming or removal)

FREE SIDEWALK

RULES & REGULATIONS UPDATES

Recently updates to the Rules, Regulations and Architectural Modification Guidelines of Welleby Management Association Inc. (changes are underlined):

- **25- Seasonal and Holiday decorations**: Seasonal/holiday decorations may be installed 2 weeks prior to the holiday and must be removed 1 week after (with the exception of Hanukkah and Christmas, where decorations may be installed the weekend after thanksgiving and should be removed by January <u>15</u> 31).
- **29- Signs**: Signs are prohibited with the following exceptions:
- a) Signs that specifically state "Bad dog" are permitted with prior written approval from WMA (owner must sign and submit the Association's architectural application for "bad dog" signage), subject to the following conditions: 1 sign per gate; sign must be rectangular and no larger than 14" wide by 10" high; sign must specifically state the words "bad dog"; no picture/images allowed on sign; sign must be installed on the fence at least 4' from ground proximate to the gate; sign must be maintained in good condition.
- b) Any owner may display 1 sign of reasonable size provided by a contractor for security services within 10 feet of the entrance to the house/unit.
- c) Any owner may display sign(s) that read "no soliciting" and/or "no trespassing" (maximum of 1 of each), provided signs do not exceed 2" X 8" each or 5" X 10" combined. Sign(s) shall be mounted on the front door or on a wall in close proximity to the front door only.
- d) Political signs are permitted to be placed on a lot not more than 30 days prior to an election under the following conditions: Only 1 sign per candidate and/or 1 sign per amendment or related issue; sign(s) may be installed only for elections/issues that are on the ballot for the precinct in which the residence lies; sign dimensions may not exceed 18" X 24"; sign(s) must be removed the day following the election; sign(s) may only be placed on an owners lot, not on any common area, swale area and not affixed to any structure or fence.
- e) This section does not apply to signage for sub-associations that may be required by law or used for common area purposes, provided such signage is approved by WMA prior to installation.
- f) No items, including but not limited to vehicles, may be displayed for sale, lease or rent on any lot or any other area within Welleby.
